General Information

A dental hygienist is a licensed professional who is part of a dental care team. They perform preventive and therapeutic oral healthcare services such as oral examinations, radiographs, oral prophylaxis, non-surgical periodontal therapy (scaling, root planning, soft tissue curettage) and administer local anesthesia and nitrous oxide-oxygen sedation for pain control as needed. Dental hygienists also apply preventive treatments which include topical fluorides and dental sealants along with instructing patients in personalized oral health care, nutrition, and the connection between oral health and one's overall health and well-being.

Successful Dental Hygiene Program students are eligible to take the National Board Dental Hygiene Examination (written) in their final year. Upon completion of the program, graduates qualify to take a regional clinical exam and the California Law & Ethics exam (written) to gain licensure.

The Dental Hygiene Health facility is located on the corner of South Rose Avenue and South Campus Road on the main campus of Oxnard College, which is located at 4000 South Rose Avenue, Oxnard. Career Opportunities

In addition to preparing students to assume roles treating diverse populations in many different health care settings including general and specialty practices, public schools, community settings, education, acute and extended care facilities, federal and state-run dental clinics and hospitals, a baccalaureate degree can lead to more career options for higher level positions in management, administration, teaching, and research development as well as providing a pathway to further one's education.

About the Program

All dental hygiene didactic instruction is taught at Oxnard College. Practical clinical experience is gained through patient experiences at the on-site Dental Health Clinic. In addition, students may have the opportunity to observe at dental specialty practices (i.e., Periodontal, Endodontic, Orthodontic, etc.) or other facilities located off-campus. Students will also engage in a variety of enrichment activities such as community health fairs, Dental Society and Dental Hygiene Association meetings, State and National Dental Professional Conventions, community service projects and outreach activities.

Accreditation

Oxnard College is accredited by the Accrediting Commission for Community and Junior Colleges of the Western Association of Schools and Colleges. The Dental Hygiene program is accredited by the Commission on Dental Accreditation.

Preparation & Prerequisites

High school courses in algebra, biology and chemistry are recommended to prepare the applicant for the prerequisite college classes. Students must have an associate degree with one of the following general education patterns, IGETC, CSU GE, or Cal-GETC, as well as the completion of the prerequisite courses for admission into the Dental Hygiene Program. Consult an Oxnard College Academic Counselor for details.

Advanced Placement (AP) Exam Score Exemption may be accepted in lieu of OC College Program English Composition and Math prerequisites.

ALL SCIENCE PREREQUISITIES MUST HAVE LABS. Prerequisite biomedical science courses can either be completed by traditional, in-person wet labs at the school or online using a physical lab kit that allows the student to conduct physical experiments in conjunction with an online synchronous meeting system with faculty oversight and teaching. This applies to the subjects of anatomy, physiology, chemistry, biochemistry, and microbiology.

APPLICATION & SELECTION: Applications are available online at oxnardcollege.edu/departments/academic/dental-hygiene and can be dropped off or mailed to the Dental Hygiene Department on campus. The application period is from January 1st – March 15th of the spring semester prior to fall entry.

QUALIFIED APPLICANTS MUST HAVE:

1. Completed all OC Dental Hygiene program prerequisites by the end of the Fall Semester prior to program entry *
2. Minimum cumulative college GPA of 3.0 (All colleges ever attended must be reported)
3. 3.0 or better GPA** upon completion of all science prerequisites (includes ANAT, CHEM, MICR, PHSO+LABS)
4. Completed all science prerequisites within a five-year period prior to application
5. High School Diploma, GED, or equivalent
6. Current CPR card (Basic Life Support CPR & AED Training for Healthcare Professionals) with in person skills portion.
7. An associate degree and the completion of one of the following general education patterns: IGETC, CSU GE, Cal-GETC.

**One Science prerequisite course may be in progress at the time of application in the spring (lecture and corresponding lab will be considered one science prerequisite). DH R001 in the spring may also be in progress.*

***As GPA calculations and course equivalencies can vary between institutions, please be sure to confirm your eligibility with an Oxnard College counselor prior to application*

Upon verification of all program admission criteria, qualified candidates will be included in a selection pool. A prioritized lottery is utilized in the initial selection process. The first 40 candidates drawn in the lottery are evaluated using a structured point-based system combined with a personal interview component. Twenty students will be selected for admission. The remaining applicants will be placed on an alternate list to fill any available spaces should an admitted student decline a place in the program. There is no wait list. Students not selected must reapply each year.

Students who take 32 units of prerequisites, with 14 units in science prerequisites at Oxnard College, are in the first pool. Candidates who take 32 units of prerequisites, with 14 units in science prerequisites at any of the VCCCD colleges or at SBCC, are included in the second pool. The remaining candidates are included in the final pool.

ASSOCIATED COSTS

Normal student expenses (textbooks, in-state tuition, college fees, etc.) for the program are estimated to be about \$11,000. In addition to the normal student expenses, the dental hygiene program requires approximately \$12,000 during the two years. These additional costs are associated with instruments, equipment, uniforms, supplies, licensure examination fees, professional dues and course expenses.
