Minutes, Academic Senate Meeting

September 23, 2019 2:00 pm

Called to order by **President Diane Eberhardy** at 2:06

Adoption of the Agenda. 1. Ishita Edwards. 2. Teresa Bonham. Carried unanimously.

Public Comment.

Teresa Bonham. Shannon is home. Cecilia Milan injured herself while horseback riding. Good thoughts to all.

Guests

Dr. Deanna McFadden, Health Center. Dr. McFadden's comments were accompanied by a slideshow. The slideshow is provided on the Oxnard College Academic Senate Website.

Highlights of Dr. McFadden's presentation:

ACHA-NCH Survey is now being done by all three college in our district. This presentation focuses on Oxnard College.

Generational status is now included in the data (whether a student is first or second generation college student, etc).

Many different measures are in the study. Half of our students feel lonely or hopeless. So depressed. It was difficult to function (33%)

Many students report feeling very sad. (56%)

9% seriously considered suicide. 2.5% had attempted suicide in the two months before the survey. Survey results are available to everyone.

We get the SPSS files for this data and can look at the data from a number of different ways.

Way more trauma than previously documented. We have no full time mental health professional in this district. Health Center coordinators are going to the board.

Students will get the email tomorrow. Be Heard is on the portal - but the link is in email. Three reminders. Can print out the thank you message if profs want to provide extra credit.

Chris Renbarger. Feedback on photocopy issue is sought. Concern was expressed about what a small amount of money this is for the college budget (**Mark Bates**). Micromanagement by reminding us to make our copies elsewhere. Steve Hall: we will have to enter numbers every time we make a copy. **Alan Hayashi**: shorten the number because you don't need the first 3 numbers in the 900 number. Can we still print from our computers? Yes. Do we have to enter a number there? Apparently not. Only repercussion of this monitoring practice will be a suggestion, not a mandate. **Anthony Rodriguez**: Convenience is important. It was learned that the copy center does deliver now and will make color copies if needed.

Amparo Martinez. Classified Senate President. Ms Martinez spoke about wanting to change culture of the college. Use PD money to bring Dr. Frank Harris to the campus for both Classified and Faculty. He is going to do a presentation on October 9, late afternoon. 2:30-4:00. Advancing Equity to Achieve Student Success. He is the Co-Director of Community College Equity Assessment Lab. Ms Martinez was asked for the rationale behind the Tri-Chairs. She mentioned that we have yet to add 9+1 to our shared governance manual. District is looking at adding tri-chairs to some committees. **Ishita Edwards**: All committees? Ms Martinez: Everything but

Curriculum. **Dr. Edwards:** What other colleges have Tri-Chairs? Ms Martinez is compiling a list. Wants a retreat at the beginning of the year and then at the end of the year. Everardo: Tri-Chair model encourages more votes on the side of management. Classified are tied to the management position.

Alan Hayashi. Service Awards. 25 years is the Big Recommendation moment. **Lois Zsarnay** received her award. Alan also spoke about load-banking and the upcoming seminar.

Tom Stough & America Barroso. Veterans are raising money for the American Red Cross. Emails were sent out, but hyperlink didn't work. It will be sent again. Minimum is \$10. You have to specify if you want it all to go to Dorian. Senate is being asked for \$200. **Agendize for action next Senate meeting.**

Tom moves to pay \$200 to match student donations. Everardo seconds. First Everardo then Teresa. No deadline.

Kevin Corse. Auto classes are full and doing really well. We have multiple paid internships. One is with 5-8 students at Ventura County Fleet services. A Ford MOU was created for Vista Ford to allow OC to enhance student learning and to provide possible job placement through the MOU. The MOU was held up at District Office for some time and then revised late in the process, thereby changing language that Ford had already approved.
