B. PG Reps and Worksheet for 2020-2021 I.C

Starting with page 4, we can discuss how the reps will be chosen. At the first meeting in Fall, we will seat the Senators for the upcoming academic year on August 24. Senators will recommend faculty from their areas to sit on Committees. Departments roll people over, which can be recommended by a Senator. Step 2: Discuss as a Senate. Senate will consider discipline, but also other rolls on campus. Tenure vs non-Tenure, how long they have been at the College. Another factor: have they served in the past. We need a mix of old and new. Specific duties of the committee work should be taken into consideration. Past experience is important. Communicating back to the Senate is important. Academic Senate hopes to encourage rotation of membership on the various committees. Academic Senate reps must report to Senate, best if that rep is a Senator. Reports should come once a month.

Kevin: Let's not exclude people unnecessarily, let's be inclusive.

Erin: It's difficult for her small department, even to get someone to Senate. She can't miss practice twice a month. Shannon: Lab has same issues.

For PBC: We are reducing by 3. Everardo wants to remain as the AFT rep if reelected.

For CUDS: Leo is on the committee and will move to the EAC seat. Everardo represents EOPS on CUDS. Mike Ketailly has a seat on CUDS. Juan Zuniga is on CUDS, maybe can move to Student Success. PDC: Anitra is leaving the committee. PEPC: Stays the same. Student Success: Ross Fuentes and Linda Webb are there now. Lois, Ana Toy and Elissa are current members of Student Success.

There was discussion of Calendaring. Looks like College Council will meet on 3rd Monday. We need a third person for CPC.

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Ishita was nominated by Josh Lieser for CPC, seconded by Linda Kamaila, unanimous. Ishita accepted.

students? José: no one has gotten back yet. VC is doing it – but hasn't
gotten back. Teresa: Can we contribute?
