Although CSU GE Breadth allows for grades of C- or better, students with a C- in College Composition or Mathematics will not have met the competency requirements to graduate with an Associate Degree. In addition, a grade of C- in Mathematics might be insufficient for satisfying prerequisites for higher-level math and science courses.</p> <p>3. Double Counting: A course cannot satisfy more than one GE area requirement even if it is listed in multiple areas.</p> <p>4. Credit will not be awarded for both the Honors and non-honors version of a course. Credit will be awarded only for the first course completed with a grade of "C" or better or "P."</p> <p>5. Credit for successfully passed AP/IB/CLEP exams may be applied to CSU GE with official test scores. See the OC catalog section on Credit by Exam for more information.</p> <p>6.
