		instrumental work. A major to their scholarship program	
		was passed. OCF will no longer require students to	
		provide receipts. There is a committee member, OC	
		student, and OC employee on the scholarship committee.	
		They are also revamping the scholarship application,	
		reducing is from 14/15 pages to 4/5.

Pres. Cobian, VP Gonzalez, and VP Renbarger OCF to reach out to Peter Parker. It's important we connect with OCF to make sure they understand our students.

VP Gonzalez noted there are now185 students in 9 classes in the newly-establish PACE program, which is starting today. Enrollment is at 74% which is "out-pacing" college-wide enrollment at 68%. We are also seeing more students returning to college but we are still down college-wide since 2019.

VP Renbarger:

- Directed folks reach out to Charlotte Farley for custodial issues or to your deans. Charlotte is the acting/interim custodial supervisor. Chris changed the custodial shifts to 3PM - 11:30PM. Some of these changes didn't work for the dental department's needs that they are working on.
- We are working on the housing application for structure funding, hiring a landscaper to focus on low-water use plants, and will be submitting an RFP to improve WiFi in HyFlex classrooms.

VP Gonzalez noted that they will begin sharing the accreditation report in mid-September (the 19th) to allow time for feedback.

Pres. Cobian acknowledged the murmur of concerns over VC receiving funding for on-campus housing. OC is not eligible at this time but we're doing a study so in the long term we can also apply for housing on campus. VP Renbarger added that when applying for construction funding you must have conducted a feasibility study. VC had already done this; we are working on it this year. NPR reported the housing shortage locally (specifically Oxnard) is the worst in the nation. This will serve to justify our request.

Charles asked about the payoff of now having solar panels. Chris replied that it's a long-term investment that will take time to off-set. It will be cost-neutral over 20-25 years. Edison will be turning off all electricity for 3 hours on 9/24 at 11pm to connect charging stations to the grid at that time.

Pres. Cobian asked if we would like regular messaging from him, similar to that which Pres. Sanchez provided in his El Condor email update. Please communicate any preference to him.

key role in changing multiple policies and procedures. She thanked everyone for their consideration. Dolores spoke, first stating she is honored to have been nominated. She has served as a Senator for 1 year and attended prior meetings as a visitor and presenter. She sees this 1-year term as an opportunity to help support the president and executive team. She has served on other PG committees and never shied away from advocating for faculty, students, and our campus' interests, even as an untenured person. She has been involved in advisory boards on campus and in the community. She is a VCCARA leadership council member and 1 of 5 members to meet with the Chancellor of our district last Friday. She is well-positioned to be a faculty voice in these spaces. Emily was not obligated to speak but gave a short plea to vote for her, noting her commitment to perform the duty of Secretary to the best of her ability and utilize the experience she acquired as notetaker for her department to maintain accurate records of Senate meetings. Senate voted to elect Emily Zwaal as Secretary. Lilia asked if we have to make our votes for VP public since it's a special election. Senators have the option to vote in the poll or to send their vote to Elissa via a private message. Dolores Ortiz was elected Vice President through a poll vote of 69% in favor, 31% for Shannon. She thanked the Senate body and Shannon. New Treasurer Ishita shared her annual report, which can also be found in Board Docs. It was a good year last year. The Senate **Business** Ishita Edwards has ~\$4,900 starting this semester. There are currently 60 Treasurer's Report people signed up for automatic deductions (\$30). There (6.01)are still about 40 people who aren't contributing. It is our job to think of ways to use that money and also to try and encourage others to contribute. Lilia noted that Amy Edwards and Mike Ketaily may no longer contribute. Della suggested planning a faculty retreat. Ishita has taken note and will follow up with this idea. Student Senate President Caruth asked that we please take a look at the Equity and President Student Equity and Achievement Plan (this can be found Achievement Elissa Caruth in BoardDocs). We are required to submit this every 3 years to receive SEAP funding. Elissa led the writing team Plan (SEAP) 1st Read for this document over the summer, who met multiple (6.02)times. It was composed of faculty, classified personnel and management. It includes a litary of services that help to

close equity gaps. We are one of the first on the PG stops to review it. Send your feedback to Pres. Caruth or Dr. Leah Alarcon by Sept. 16th. Elissa will bring it back for 2nd reading and final approval at our second meeting in Oct. This is written by faculty with administrative input. VP Ortiz asked if there are any particular sections she would prefer feedback on. Pres. Caruth suggested she look at the section on race consciousness since she is knowledgeable in this area. Please look at the whole document but focus on the metrics. Old Pres. Caruth shared the goals and action steps from last Senate President year and went through each (attached in BoardDocs). Business AS Goal Elissa Caruth (She would like one member of the Executive Team to create a workgroup on this). She noted the following: Tracking (7.01) We strengthened our ISLOs. We reviewed documents for accreditation. We made headway on inclusivity and students with disabilities. Della noted she would like another action step to address students with disabilities. Pres. Caruth asked her to be part of the workgroup. Ishita recommended we remove the ISLO goal since this has now been accomplished. Josh noted he would like to revisit an idea for recognizing retirees (add as goal?). Della mentioned that on All College Day faculty were discussing how long it's been since we've been together. The long hiatus away, in addition to having new hires, warrants a focus on building camaraderie through social events. Faculty are feeling depressed and alone. When faculty feel uplifted, this makes them better teachers, which is better for students. Pres. Caruth recommended we continue the newfaculty mentor program through the Senate. Pres. Caruth recommended adding the following as new goals: Transfer, CTE, and closing equity gaps (more funding coming for this) The Exec. Team will discuss creating a workgroup and may be reaching out to some senators. If interested please reach out to Elissa (best way is via email, which she will respond to following our meeting). She would love to see participation across campus (do not need to be senators). The department chairs will be discussing this this semester and looking at best practices. Let Elissa know your thoughts on this. Lilia noted there isn't a one-size-fits-all solution. Teresa suggested we consider elevating the DE committee to a PG committee considering the importance of online teaching for all since COVID. Elissa said this will require changes up the line, but we can make changes locally.

Caruth plans to run for Academic Senate President in the long term (for this year and the following 2-year term). She will ask you for help, will rely on the Executive Team, and will ask for honesty, truthfulness, and transparency. President Caruth called for a moment of gratitude for our students. We have full classes and waitlists. She also acknowledged gratitude for each person present. Her goal for Senate is for us to be a community and lean on one another. She asked everyone to post in the chat why they are here. Her goal is for us to enact positive transformational change as a collective body. Our purpose and charge are constant. She represents all of us as our Senate President and will share our ideas. She asked folks to email her to let her know what's going on in our classrooms and to say hello. President Caruth plans to bring resources across our campus to the Senate. At our next meeting we will have representatives from the Transfer Center and Basic Needs visit. Senators should bring information they learn back to their respective departments. Pres. Caruth called on teachers to encourage students to get degrees because we know this translates into higher pay and a better quality of life.
