	Alan Hayashi	Now that we are back on campus, where do students take assessments for online classes if students are not vaccinated? Discussion: Senate President Amy Edwards: During public comment we don't answer questions. Can you email me and we'll send you an answer by email?	

	Deanna McFadden	Thank you all for the very thoughtful gift. I really appreciate the acknowledgement from the people I respect so much. Students are having a lot of confusion about vaccination status and coming to campus. They are very frustrated. Please work with them. We do want to make sure their education is not interrupted.

Guests	Luis Gonzales Accreditation Update	Dean Gonzalez provided an update on our Accreditation process. This Fall we worked to finalize rough draft. What's next? We met in February and reviewed, working to clean up evidence and edits working through Teams in Microsoft. In March we will be sharing in PG committees as a first review. We will assign PG committees to review sections as content experts. Then June-August, a writing team will work on it with a professional editor and they'll add graphics. Fall 22 we'll ask for help in reviewing the full document with a second read in October to submit December 22. Then they'll have follow-up questions and they visit in 2023. Discussion Senate President Amy Edwards: Faculty, remember we'll team up and read focused sections.	
	Art Sandford VPAA	Our VPAA answered questions and comments from faculty. It's great to see so many people on campus today. It's a great vibe. It's not easy for many folks. Looking forward to Summer and Fall scheduling. Summer schedule goes live tomorrow. Ventura's is up. We grew last summer by 20%, so it'll look similar. Fall we are looking for a more balanced approach. Discussion: Senate Treasurer Ishita Edwards: I have a question about the survey results from student (6.01 in BoardDocs). When we ask, do we know what their background is from different disciplines?	

	Art Sandford: Not so much. But the survey is online, so there is bias from the online perspective, but it doesn't tell the whole story. They want more of both. They are looking at their plans for the future and they are looking for more online classes in the future. That mode of delivery isn't going anywhere. It provides more options. Rainer Mack: Fall scheduling, what does the executive team think about what that "balance" between in-person and online [might look like]? Art Sandford: We are a comprehensive community college, so there isn't one size fits all. I'd guess 45-50% online Fall. It'll vary by discipline. Alan Hayashi: Student success online was noticeable less than on-ground. Is that having any effect on our choices of modality? Art Sandford: Traditionally there is a 4-6% lag, but it varies by discipline and instructor, but when I see 40% success rate, I'd ask about it. We do take that into consideration, but as everyone has become more skilled [online], the gap is closing and [it] has been since before the pandemic. Senator Lois Zsarnay: We talk about Online vs Live Zoom and our terminology hasn't caught up, but live interaction needs another designation. Is there a timeline when we can pull that data apart? Art Sandford: Title 9 defines space and time, even though synchronous is defined by title 9. We can pull data from synchronous vs asynchronous and that would be interesting, but we also have partially online. It's a great research question for IE folks. I do wonder if longer-term, if they'll continue to favor live zoom or online or in-person. Senator Cat Yang: 50% online are you talking about zoom and asynchronous? Senator Lilia Ruvalcaba: I've seen different campus are using the work assigned hours as a designation.

Senate President Amy Edwards: [ADS is] already in the pipeline, this is a new list. Alan Hayashi: If someone is already on the list from 2021, that order is not going to change. They'll all work together. We are just looking at this list of requests here. How does someone who's not familiar [like a new President] with it select? Senate President Amy Edwards: A conversation will need to happen with these lists. We sit down and we have a conversation. Senator Teresa Bonham: Do we know how many we will be able to hire? How is our current enrollment going to inform that?

Meetings Update	Amy Edwards	DCAS: Meeting will be Feb. 17, 2022 (no report today, but new DAC Positions document attached) The District Administrative Center (DAC) is requesting 15 requests for a total cost of \$2.4 million. This roughly corresponds to a change in the budget allocation model from 7.1% to 8.3% for the DAC component and to an approximately 19% increase in the roughly \$12.9 million DAC budget. Many areas are understaffed districtwide, and the DAC is no exception. Which positions does Senate think will best support the colleges?	
		DCHR: Meeting was Feb. 10, 2022 policy review DTRW-I: Meeting was Feb. 10, 2022 (New Curriculum attached) policy review DTRW-SS: Meeting was Feb. 10, 2022 policy review BoT: Three recent meetings: Feb. 2, Feb. 12, and Feb. 15, 2022 board reports, the new DAC positions will be discussed. Take a look at what would serve us best. It is on the budget committee for a detailed look at the money. DCEM: Meeting was Feb. 4, 2022 EEO: As needed.	
		Discussion: Senator Teresa Bonham: We are the rainmakers. We know enrollment's down even though the state is giving us money. For them to hire 15 is not a great idea right now. We can't even hire faculty replacements. Senate Treasurer Ishita Edwards: I'd ask, some may be necessary, historically in past budgets, the DAC used to have 6.1% of the total budget and we were quite efficient, now, over the years it has grown to 6.8% to 8.3% at the same time that our enrollments are declining. This is a long-term [financial] commitment and I don't see the amount of funds coming to the district once we are no longer held harmless. I question the timing. Alan Hayashi: Just to add not that long ago we only had 2 Vice Chancellors and now we have another 3 Vice Chancellors with huge staffs and there wasn't any discussion on hiring those. Senate Secretary Marcia Fulkerson: At the last board meeting the board wanted to increase the Chancellor salary range in hiring a new Chancellor. The Chancellor recently got a 19% raise to earn \$297 thousand a year and now to a range of \$315 thousand to \$350 thousand using the argument that they need to	

recruit the best. They are not calling it a raise they are calling it recruitment. I don't know how much say Senate or faculty or AFT have about the allocation of this money, but we need to pay attention here and push back strategically. Senate President Amy Edwards: I agree, we will continue to discuss. It will be discussed at the other Senates. There are different positions [requested] here, maybe some [of them are] needed. Some came out of the pandemic they need more IT. Senator Teresa Bonham: Did they say where the money would come from? Can they get student workers? Remember when they bought that building? Can they rent that out to make money? Senate President Amy Edwards: The money comes off the top. Senator Tom Stough: [I think] about the imminent retirement of existing chancellors and this should be under the next chancellor's prevue. Senator Rainer Mack: Keep the original point any increase should accompany be a good faith effort for cost savings. Senate VP Elissa Caruth: Once this happens, [this money] is not recoverable that'll keep us in a small college role which will impact the budget. That must be beneficial to the district. We are looking at retirements across the board that will not be replaced. It appears they are lining their coffers. Can we ask for transparency and campus personnel on those committees? We need to fund retirements first. Senate President Amy Edwards: I've taken notes. I'll bring a summary and see how it's discussed at the meeting and go from there.
Chat: Senate VP Elissa Caruth: ABSOLUTELY @ Teresa! Senator Catalina Yang: @Teresa nicely said!! Senator Thomas A Stough: Thank you, Lynn H.!! As a former law office librarian, I know about "rainmakers"! That's what classroom faculty are. Senator Thomas A Stough: Lynn F., sorry. Senate President Amy Edwards: see slide 8 where all of the positions are listed Senator Lois F Zsarnay: Well said Teresa! Then they will say that there's not enough money to replace retiring faculty or new hires or raises! Good point Ishita about the % of budget to district! Alan Hayashi: Over the years the DAC percentage has increased while the allocation had increased dramatically. from \$100 Million to its current amount

		Senate Secretary Marcia Fulkerson: Good summary, Amy Senate VP Elissa Caruth: Good points, Teresa! Senator Lois F Zsarnay: Good questions Teresa! Alan Hayashi: The current allocation is almost \$153 Million. It is troubling that this Chancellor is pushing his ideas as he is leaving. It may not be the direction of the new Chancellor. New Business: Treasurer's Report	Senate Treasurer Ishita Edwards	Treasurer Edwards's report also in BoardDocs: There have been no expenses or revenues incurred since 1/24/22. The available balance in the Academic Senate checking accounts is \$3862.00. In Spring 2022, the Academic Senate expects to have some expenses such as the two scholarships we fund with the help of the Oxnard College Foundation, and the purchase of student artwork. <b>Since only around 44 full time faculty (out of over 100 total) had either contributed via automatic payroll deduction or directly (via check),</b> the total amount collected by the end of the 2020-2021 fiscal/academic year, was \$1410 from full-time faculty and another \$35 from 7 part-time faculty. Obviously, we can do better. Our fresh efforts to solicit contributions in Fall 2021, yielded some additional commitments via automatic payroll deductions that will be taken out of our salaries in April 2022. These will count toward our due's contributed automatic payroll deductions will show, despite the retirement of 7 full-time faculty on this list the number of full-time faculty who have committed to automatic payroll deductions has increased to 62 (an approximately 40% increase in the number of full-time contributors.) If this holds true then our revenue should increase from \$1380.00 (2020-2021) to close to \$1900.00 in 2021-2022. This is good news, indeed!	

	Still, we know that many of our colleagues have yet to contribute. Therefore, another request for Academic Senate dues commitment (via payroll automatic deduction) will be sent out soon. Although the email will be sent to department chairs and to all faculty, it will also include a list of those who have already paid or made a commitment to have the amount due automatically deducted from their salary (once a year) at the district payroll. Please check the attached list of faculty, full and part-time who have authorized the one-time annual deduction from their pay-check (\$30 for FT, and \$5 for part-time), and please affirm that all your department colleagues are on the list. If they are not, then please help your Academic Senate reach out to the ones who are yet to authorize their automatic payroll deductions toward their AS contributions.
