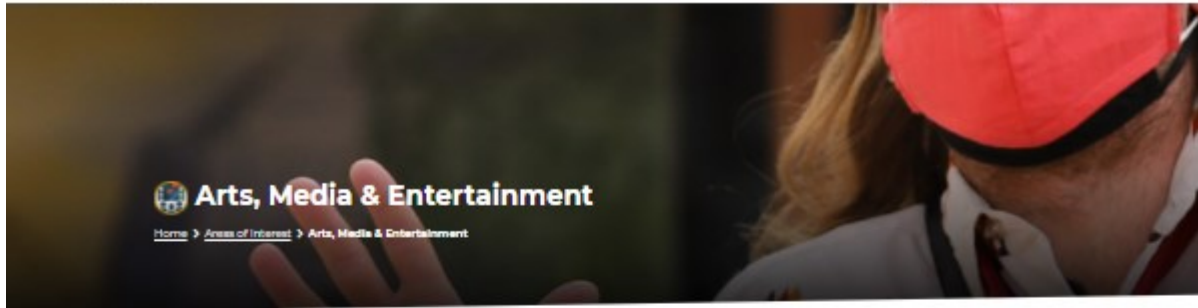

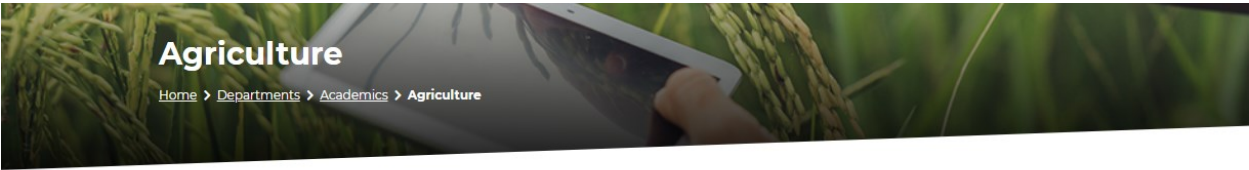

Areas of Interest

The Areas of Interest at Oxnard College are groupings of similar programs that can lead to similar employment opportunities. It is designed to help students focus on a pathway of study applicable to their unique strengths, personality, and interests. The college's goal is to help limit unnecessary units or courses while also providing broad career and major exploration for undecided students.

Learning and Career Pathways

Learning and career pathways are groups of careers that share common themes or require similar skills.

<p>Hands-on Learning</p> <p> The Hands-on Learning pathway, as it suggests, provides a lot of applied learning. Suppose you like building things with your hands or want to enter the ever-evolving world of computer networking. In that case, this pathway will have you critically thinking, analyzing problems, and working with technology beyond the traditional office space. Some of the career options include service and repair, construction and installation, sales, manufacturing, plant maintenance, Cisco networking, wireless networking, cybersecurity, and Microsoft operating systems.</p> <p>EXPLORE →</p>	<p>Business & Hospitality</p> <p> Business and Hospitality's pathway is an excellent option for students looking for opportunities that require creativity, entrepreneurship, leadership, details, and independence. All of these are skills and attributes necessary for careers in Finance, Public Administration, Marketing, or the hands-on learning opportunities in the fast-paced Culinary Arts to running a restaurant or resort. This pathway will allow students to transfer, upgrade their current business skills, or enter the workforce immediately.</p> <p>EXPLORE →</p>
<p>Education</p> <p> The pathway in Education prepares students for careers with a socially conscious focus. You will learn to help your community enhance their innate talents while teaching new skills. Typical careers include Childcare, Paraprofessor, K-6 teacher, and may become the first step toward becoming a School Principal or one of many other administrative positions in education. It is a great career option for those looking for social environments, interacting with diverse groups, informing or training, creating growth mindsets, critical thinking, and planning/organizing. The pathway allows for both immediate entry to the workforce and transfer to a university.</p> <p>EXPLORE →</p>	<p>Language & Literature</p> <p> The Language and Literature pathway can provide an avenue to careers in Interpretive, Translating, Middle and High School Teacher, Journalism, Editor, Public Relations, Advertising, and other global opportunities. This area of interest may be a good fit if you like meeting new and diverse populations, learning about cultures other than your own, engaging in critical thinking, and want a more independent work environment.</p> <p>EXPLORE →</p>
<p>Law, Culture, & Society</p> <p> The pathway of Law, Culture, and Society is the opportunity to impact society from multiple angles with a social justice perspective. If you like to better understand and help shape your community, this vital investigative pathway will allow you to connect your other interest areas to various work environments. Sample careers are found in Law, Education, Public Policy, Counseling, and Social Researcher.</p> <p>EXPLORE →</p>	<p>Public Safety, Health & Wellness</p> <p> The pathway of Public Safety, Health, and Wellness focuses on professions that promote a healthy and safe society. Programs in this area prepare you for certificates, degrees, transfer, and careers in areas of health, wellness, and safety. Students can learn to become Physical Therapists, Physicians Assistants, Registered Dietitians, Nurses, Drug and Alcohol Counselors, Dental Assistants, Dental Hygienists, Emergency Medical Technicians, Fire Fighters, Ocean Patrol Lifeguards, Public Health Workers, Personal Trainers, Sports Psychologists, Health Educators. This area may appeal to you if you enjoy problem solving, helping people, and are concerned about the welfare of others.</p> <p>EXPLORE →</p>
<p>STEM</p> <p> The pathway known as STEM is for students to engage in Science, Technology, Engineering, and Math to discover concrete solutions to problems that society faces in everyday life. Most people think of careers like Computer Programmer, Engineer, and Doctor, but did you know this is a pathway that will lead you to Law, Architecture, Actuaries, and Forestry opportunities? Most people in these careers have interests that allow them to work both in teams and independently, have an eye for details, and like solving puzzles.</p> <p>EXPLORE →</p>	<p>Visual & Creative Arts</p> <p> The skills learned in the Visual and Performing Arts pathway will help students maximize their creative talents and mold them to a future career in opportunities such as Photography, Digital Design, Media or High School Teaching, Fashion Design, and Public Relations positions. People will gravitate toward this pathway interested in self-expression and learn how to communicate effectively in various environments.</p> <p>EXPLORE →</p>

The Associate of Science in Automotive Technology Degree prepares students as entry-level technicians for the automotive field. This degree will provide students with the skills and knowledge necessary to successfully perform diagnosis and repair in the automotive shop environment, using a combination of classroom and hands-on shop experiences. Students will be prepared to pass National Institute for Automotive Service Excellence (ASE) Certification tests and will also be able to earn Certificates of Achievement as they complete coursework on their path to earning this Associate degree. General Studies Pattern I - Natural Sciences Emphasis

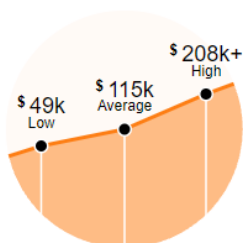
Associate in Arts

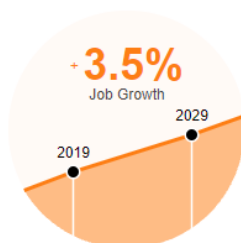

Growth

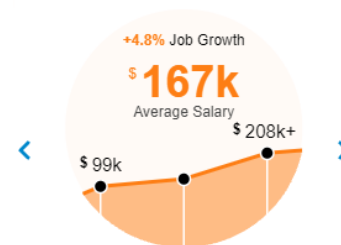
Career opportunities for this program are expected to grow nationwide from 2019 to 2029.
