## What is Financial Aid?



Financial aid is money received from an outside source to help pay for a higher education.

### It can cover costs like:

- tuition and fees
- books and supplies
- Food and Housing
- transportation
- some living expenses



### Financial Aid Money \$\$ can come from:

- > The U.S. federal government
- The state in which you live in
- The college you attend
- A nonprofit or private organization

## TYPES OF FINANCIAL AID

There are two basic types of financial aid:

### 1. "Free Gift" aid:

Money that does not have to be paid back

• (grants) and (scholarships)

### 2."Self-help" aid:

Money that you work or that you will need to pay back later

• (work-study) or (loans)

### **State Grants**

- Cal Grant (Available at CA Community Colleges & Universities)
- Student Success Completion
  Grant (Available at CA Community Colleges Only)
- California Dream Act Service Incentive Grant Program (Undocu Students only)
- Chafee Grant (Current/former foster youth)
- State University Grant (CSUs only)

### Federal Grants\*

Free money based on financial need

- Federal Pell Grant
- Federal Supplemental Educational
   Opportunity Grant (FSEOG).

\*FAFSA applicants only



### Federal Work-Study

\*Gives students the opportunity to work on campus.

- Find a Job on Campus
- Earn work experience.
- FWS income does not have to be reported on the FAFSA or CA Dream Act

### **Scholarships**

Awarded based on various criteria

- College Foundation Office
- Employers
- Community
- Non-Profits

### Loans

- \*Funds that are borrowed and needs to be paid back, with interest
- Federal Direct Loans\*
- Private Loans\*
- DREAM Loan\*

## **Oxnard College Promise**

### **Requirements** \*\*Criteria Subject To Change

- Submit a 2024-2025 FAFSA or CADAA
- Apply for Admission
- Be a California resident or AB 540 student. Residency is determined by Admissions and Records.
- Enroll full-time (12 Units or more)

\*We highly recommend you complete New Student Requirements Listed Below!

- Assessment/Multiple Measures
- New Student Orientation
- Develop an abbreviated Student Educational Plan





### Cal Grants — A, B and C

### Cal Grant A

- Available at a 4-year institution
- Minimum 3.00 high school GPA
- Can only be used for tuition and fees
- Award amount varies for 4yr Universities
- If awarded at a CA Community College, will be held in reserve up to two years until the student transfers

### Cal Grant B

- Available at a 4-year institution or CA Community College
- Minimum 2.00 high
   school GPA
- Award amount up to \$1,648 at Community
   College
- Award amount varies for 4yr Universities

### Cal Grant C

- Available at CA Community College
- Available for students pursuing a vocational, occupational, or technical program
- Award amount \$1,094
- If eligible, complete the Cal Grant C Supplement Form and return to the CA Student Aid Commission by the requested deadline.



# Cal Grant







Cal Grant Eligibility is determined by the California Student Aid Commission (CSAC)

Cal Grant Program provides financial assistance to qualified California residents and AB 540 students. Awards are based on a students GPA, merit and need (income & asset information).

### How to be eligible for the Cal Grant:

- ✓ Submit a FAFSA or CA Dream Act Application by March 2<sup>nd</sup>
- √ High school must certify your GPA above 2.00
- ✓ California Resident or AB540 California exempt







### **Student Success Completion Grant (SSCG)**

The SSCG is administered by the California Community Colleges (CCC) and provides a grant to students who meet certain eligibility criteria



### Requirements

You must be awarded a Cal Grant B or C

You must be attending a CA Community College



### **Enrolled Full-Time**

Enroll in 12-14.99 Units = \$1298 per semester

Enroll in 15 units or more= \$4000 per semester



# FAFSA OR CA DREAM ACT

A student's eligibility for financial aid is determined through one application!

Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) www.fafsa.gov



If you are a **U.S. citizen, Permanent Resident,** or an authorized **VISA** holder. The FAFSA is the right application for you. The information you provide in your FAFSA determines what financial aid you receive.

CA Dream Act Application (CADAA)
www.caldreamact.org



If you are a student who is **undocumented** or are under the Consideration of Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA). The California Dream Act Application is the right form for you. The information you provide in your CA Dream act determines what financial aid you receive.

Submit the AB540 Affidavit form to Admissions and Records office.

### Create an Account (FSA ID)

Whether you're a student, parent, or borrower, you'll need to create your own account to complete federal student aid tasks.

#### What You Can Use Your Account For

- Filling out the Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) form

- · Completing loan counseling
- · Using the Public Service Loan Forgiveness Help Tool

- · Your own mobile phone number and/or email address

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

To access the FAFSA form, all students are required to have an FSA ID (account username and password). If the student doesn't have an FSA ID, they can select "Create an Account."

### What's New?



The State of California (State Budget Law) adopted a new requirement.

All local education agencies, including high schools and charter schools, must confirm that all high school seniors complete a FAFSA or CADAA. This requirement comes in immediately!

# **NEW 2024-2025 FAFSA CHANGES**

### A Better FAFSA Process Means a Better Future for Everyone

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA®) process has changed to implement provisions of the FUTURE Act and the FAFSA Simplification Act. The FAFSA changes are being implemented in phases, with full implementation of major provisions in the 2024-25 award year.

### The changes will provide

- a new launch date: FAFSA application available December 1, 2023
- parents must log in using an FSA ID and provide consent for the U.S.
   Department of Education (ED) to obtain their federal tax information
   automatically from the IRS and apply it to their section of the student's
   FAFSA form. If they don't provide consent, the student will not be able to
   receive federal student aid.
- a more streamlined application process, expanded eligibility for federal student aid, and a new user experience
- replacing the Expected Family Contribution (EFC) with the Student Aid Index(SAI)

# Received by colleges listed on FAFSA/CADAA

 Colleges/universities will contact students via email, student portal, or by mail.



- A student may be asked to submit <u>additional</u>
  <u>documentation</u> to determine eligibility
  (example: a student selected for verification)
- Students should followup with their college/university.

- •Some colleges/universities may not process a financial aid package until the student has been officially admitted to the university.


