- E. Lawley thanked everyone who participated in the Heart Walk. The team raised more than \$5k.
- Today's 4pm women's soccer match will be fundraising for breast cancer awareness.

5. Guests

5.01 Deans

- Dean Steve Hall shared that the Department of Public Safety recently submitted their program review and hiring is in progress.
- Dean of Liberal/LLRC, Dr. Amy Edwards, is working on new hires with her department (including full-time instructor positions for ASL and Chicano Studies). She is new to
 the position but has worked in a variety of roles including Academic Senate President, department chair, and within the District, that have given her a well-rounded
 perspective
- Dean Isaac Rodriguez Lupercio is the new Interim Dean of Career Education. He began in April. This week his department is interviewing for a full-time accountant and will be hiring a full-time position for Early Childhood Education in the Spring. They are also conducting program review. His office is in OE-14 and he encourages people to stop by and introduce themselves.
- Dean Eliseo Gonzalez is the Acting Dean of Student Success. His department is working on hiring, program review, and increasing dual enrollment numbers. Students and our peers are feeling anxiety so he encouraged professors to invite Chris Domasin and his team to speak to classes. This is important to address early on.
- Dean Paloma Vargas goes by the pronouns she/they/ella. She shared a little about her background as a proud Tejana, hailing from Texas, having worked in the field of
 microbiology. She thanked her department for their work. She is working with Eliseo on dual enrollment and also trying to get students back on campus for labs.

5.02 Online catalog presentation, Paris Trujillo

- Paris Trujillo showcased the new catalog, which is now online and easy to navigate (there are no PDF students must scroll through). You will also see the catalogs for MC and VC. Under "Catalog Home" you can navigate to "Programs and Courses" to find information on these. Professors can edit the "Overview" but course and program edits need to go through the curriculum process. Once CIM edits have been made, they will automatically be input on the website. The college will not be printing the catalog anymore, but you can easily print certain pages.
 - G. Lopez mentioned that as a counselor she prefers the hardcopy. P. Trujillo noted that under "General Education" options you'll find IGETC requirements.
 They're also added to the "Programs and Courses" list. She still recommends utilizing the checklist that Shannon Davis shares because it's all on one page.
 - L. Ruvalcaba asked where information about the faculty can be found. It is now under "About the College," which is under "Programs and Courses"
 - I. Edwards asked whether courses that are linked to other courses/cross listed will show up in the correct places automatically. Any change made during the curriculum process in CIM will automatically show up on the website.

5.03 Laura Knight, Instructional Technologist, Chris Renbarger VP Business Services, Dr. Luis Gonzalez, VPAA

- L. Knight demonstrated how to navigate the updated Distant Education (DE) Hub. There are modules on substantive interaction, accreditation, HTML tips, course evaluation, and compliance, among others. She asked how we would like for her to communicate with us regarding changes, etc. as she doesn't want to inundate our inboxes. E. Lawley said she would prefer emails to come directly from Laura. Weekly may be too frequently.
- Over the past few years there has been discussion of creating a Student Support Services hub that lives on the website. They will be putting a link in the Canvas course
 navigation that says, "Student Services," which will take students to the webpage. Be careful not to hide it in your classes when spring courses roll out. Teachers can
 publish it as a module to alter as much as they'd like, and they also have the option to unpublish it. It includes links to policies and Laura will update these each semester
 to make sure they are current.
- There is also a Canvas tutorials page for teachers.

- ASG Director of Student Life, Paola Lopez, informed the Senate of upcoming events through ASG. 8.01 Treasurer's Report

Let Ishita know if a name is missing. We're already committed to supporting two scholarships (\$350 each), a piece of student art (\$250 or less), and a gift.

8.02 OCAS Thanksgiving Potluck and Community Building

- L. Ruvalcaba suggested we contribute \$100 200 in December for our potluck/academic faculty social. We can use AFT funds of \$200 but if we do it must be open to all faculty, not only senators. Everyone appeared okay with this. This money would cover decorations and supplies, food, and a possible room reservation. T. Stough shared a logistics form in the chat for people to use to propose a plan.
 - A date still needs to be determined. A Friday or during a Senate meeting were discussed as options.
 - The planning group will meet and bring back specifics to our Oct. 24th meeting. Lilia would like more people involved, so please reach out to her.
 - L. Ruvalcaba made a motion to approve funding of up to \$200 from Senate for food and supplies for the faculty potluck. I. Edwards made a 2nd motion. The motion passed.

• D. Ortiz shared information from last February's meeting that had been researched. We had a t-shirt quote of \$9 each (+\$2.50 for double-sided) with a production time of 5-7 working days. We don't need to use this but can look at what we previously discussed. Several questions were posed: Do we want to further this conversation or drop it altogether?
