LOTE is a UC graduation requirement & not required for certification or the COA. US History, Constitution, & American ideals is also not required for Cal-GETC certification or the COA. Courses included on Cal-GETC must be both CSU and UC transferable. Only coursework from **regionally accredited institutions** may be applied to Cal-GETC.
