

# **Local Goal Setting**

In the 2017 **Vision for Success**, the California Community College Chancellor's Office and Board of Governors established ambitious system-wide goals for improved student outcomes. Now local colleges have an opportunity to articulate how they will contribute to reaching the system-wide goals for improvement.



## **GOAL 1** Completion

**System-wide goal**: Increase by at least 20 percent the number of CCC students annually who acquire associate degrees, credentials, certificates, or specific job-oriented skill sets.

Aligned college-level goal:

- Oxnard College will increase the total number of completed associate degrees from 749 in 2016-17 to 899 in 2021-22, an increase of 20 percent.
- Oxnard College will increase the number of completed CCCCO-approved certificates from 726 in 2016-17 to 871 in 2021, an increase of 20 percent.



### **GOAL 2** Transfer

**System-wide goal**: Increase by 35 percent the number of CCC students system-wide transferring annually to a UC or CSU.

Aligned college-level goal:

- Oxnard College will increase the number of completed ADT degrees from 388 in 2016-17 to 524 in 2021-22, and increase in 35 percent.
- Oxnard College will increase the number of transfers to UC/CSU from 465 in 2016-17 to 628 in 2021-22, an increase on 35 percent.



# **GOAL 3** Unit Accumulation

**System-wide goal**: Decrease the average number of units accumulated by CCC students earning associate degrees, from approximately 87 total units to 79 total units—a decrease of 10 percent.

Aligned college-level goal:

 Oxnard College will decrease the average units earned per completed associate degree from 78 to in 2016-17 to 70 in 2021, a decrease of 10 percent.

#### **GOAL 4** Workforce

**System-wide goal**: Increase the percent of exiting students who report being employed in their field-of-study, from the most recent statewide average of 69 percent to 76 percent, an increase of 10 percent.

Aligned college-level goal:

 Oxnard College will increase the percent of existing CTE students who report being employed in their field of study from 69% (86 students) in 2014-15 (latest statistics) to 76 percent, an increase in 10 percent.



## **GOAL 5** Equity

**System-wide goal**: Reduce equity gaps across all of the above measures through faster improvements among traditionally underrepresented student groups, with the goal of cutting achievement gaps by 40 percent within 5 years and fully closing those achievement gaps for good within 10 years.



Many different types of students are taking classes in this program area. It may be helpful to tailor your programs based on the type of student.






# Race/Ethnicity

Oxnard College, All Programs, All Credit, 2016-2017




